



RELOCATION UPDATE

FEBRUARY UPDATE

The CRC and the Building subcommittee are working with the architects of Alley Poyner Macchietto to refine the insights that were developed at the December Workshops when the Relocation Committees and Building Committees met with the architects for two days of intensive discussions about building design.

The following goals determined at past congregational workshops guide our decision making as we work through the design process of the new building. They are: Architectural Expression, Material Quality, Budget Adherence, Program Space, Durability, Sustainability, Functionality, and Use of Daylight and Views.

Currently the CRC is reviewing energy efficiency options in order to build an environmentally sustainable church. There is an ongoing cost/ benefit analysis intended to meet the needs and resources of our congregation. Once some of these decisions are made a projected budget of annual operating costs can be estimated.

Since 2015 the Chairs of the Relocation Capital Campaign, Cyndi Kugler and Don Otis, along with the CRC, have been working diligently to align fundraising goals with the building budget and potential congregation financial resources. The theme of the Campaign will be Breaking New Ground: Spiritually and Physically and incorporates the spiritual benefits as well as the physical benefits of our relocation. Watch this space for news regarding the kickoff of the capital campaign.

A congregational update and the 2016 budget for relocation matters will be presented at the annual Meeting on February 7.




