TRI-FAITH PICNIC AUGUST 14

Countryside will once again host all three faiths for the Annual Tri-Faith Picnic on Sunday, August 14, from 12:30-2:30 PM. There will be games and activities for all ages as well as plenty of food and beverages. This is a wonderful opportunity to spend time with our new neighbors and get to know each other better.

Grilled Halal Beef Burgers, Kosher Hot dogs, and cold drinks and water will be provided. We are asking each family to bring a potluck dish to share with everyone (plan a dish to serve 20 people). Keeping Jewish and Muslim food practices in mind, we ask that you please stay away from pork (not even bacon in the salads, please!), gelatin or shellfish. If you do use any of these, please list the ingredients of your recipe on your dish so our volunteers can make signs for our guests.

As we gather with our neighbors, perhaps ask them about their dietary customs and how they

follow them in their faith traditions. It will be a great way to learn from one another, and show our neighbors that who they are matters to us. See you in the buffet line!

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

What does halal mean? Halal is an Arabic word that means "permissible." In terms of food, it means food that is permissible according to Islamic law. For a meat to be certified "halal," it cannot be a forbidden cut (such as meat from hindquarters) or animal (such as pork.)

What is a kosher hotdog? The primary difference between kosher and non-kosher hot dogs is that Kosher hot dogs do not contain pork. Kosher hot dogs also are made from beef or poultry that has been slaughtered according to Jewish law. Like other hot dogs, kosher dogs contain high quality cuts of meat and spices.



NEW SCHOLAR IN RESIDENCE

The Center for Faith Studies at Countryside Community Church is pleased to have Rabbi Aryeh Azriel, Rabbi Emeritus of Temple Israel as the new scholar in residence. Rabbi Azriel will office at Countryside and offer education for Countryside and the community on the Jewish understanding of Hebrew scriptures, the midrash tradition, and historical and cultural understandings that undergird all of the teachings of the man we Christians know as Jesus.

FALL FAITH STUDIES LECTURE SERIES

Center for Faith Studies Fall 2016 Lectures: Who Do You Say That I Am? Conversations With the Soul

August 4 at 7:00 PM- Roger Gabriel, Master Educator, Chopra Center The Law of Dharma - Fulfilling Life's Potential.

Following the news of recent weeks, it is easy to become fearful, anxious and distressed. It is easy to become un-moored from the center and believe that God has given up on the world. If this describes how you have been feeling, give yourself a gift and attend the first CFS event for the season! Roger Gabriel was born in Liverpool, England and spent his formative years in the United Kingdom where he first learned meditation. Roger has assisted Deepak Chopra with numerous training programs, seminars and workshops, taught thousands of people on all continents to meditate, and assisted in training hundreds to be teachers of meditation, Ayurveda and yoga. Roger currently serves as a Chopra Master Educator, member of the Chopra Center Certification's Advisory Board, and teaches regularly at Chopra Center workshops, seminars and teacher training programs. His presentation will focus on the law of dharma - the first step of which begins with the discovery of the true self -or soul- and ends with how this self is uniquely equipped to serve others in this time and place.

August 25 at 7:00 PM- Melvin Bray, Author, Convener and Story-Teller Better: Waking Up to Who We Could Be.

When some people speak, you want to take notes. When Melvin speaks, I want to belong." -Brian McLaren, Author, Speaker, Activist

Melvin Bray is a Darkwood Brew favorite who will be in Omaha for the first time this fall! An author, convener and storyteller, Bray has a quality about him that sets people at ease even as they address the intractable issues of the day. His newest book, coming in September, asks "What if we could actually change the world by telling better stories? What if the world we have—with its racism, sexism, heterosexism, ableism, religious hatred, ecological disregard is exactly the world we have spun into existence through the stories we have told?" Melvin Bray insists that a better world is possible if the stories around which we organize our lives begin to match the beauty we imagine is possible. Bray puts forth his own daring yet faithful re-imaginings of classic faith stories that inspire more beautiful, more just, more virtue-filled ways of being in the world.

WORKSHOP OPPORTUNITY - Melvin will lead a reflection and writing workshop the next morning, August 26 from 8 AM to 12:00 PM at Countryside. Titled, Better Stories, Better World, this ambitious 4-hour workshop is divided into two parts. The first will examine how we tell our faith stories. The second, how we enact those stories of faith in our daily lives. We will discuss how the ways we tell our faith stories shape the ways we live our lives—for the good and the bad. Finally, participants will practice better ways of being in the world as it relates to racial equity, diversity and inclusion—ways of being that reflect the beauty, justice and virtue we say we want to see in the world. Participants are encouraged to bring their curiosity and daring, humility and flexibility to this time of collective discovery and learning.

All events are \$10. Tickets can be purchased between services on Sunday, August 21 and Sunday, August 28. Tickets are also available at EventBrite.com (search Center for Faith Studies) or at the door.

The Board of Christian Outreach (BOCO) was recently pleased to give a Small Service Grant from Countryside's Faith and the Environment (FatE) for a dual 50 gallon composter that is already in use on the church property! FatE initiated composting during Vacation Bible School as part of "How we Care for Creation". The composter will allow us to start utilizing some of our food waste and coffee grounds to enrich the soil here at Countryside.

COMPOSTING IS EASY TO GET RIGHT if you understand a few guidelines;

COMPOST: coffee grounds, fruits, vegetables, egg shells, leaves

NOT COMPOST: bones, meat, dairy, seeds, grain

Balance layers of wet/green(nitrogen) items with layers of dry/brown(carbon) items

*Always leave top layer brown to keep flying insects and odors away.


