

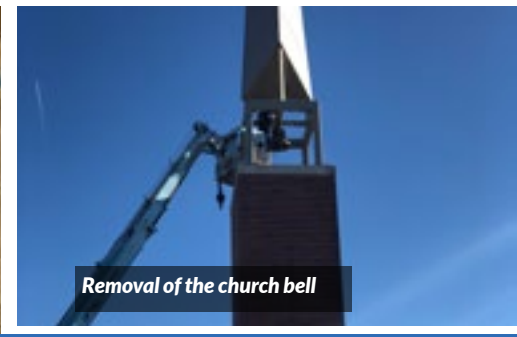

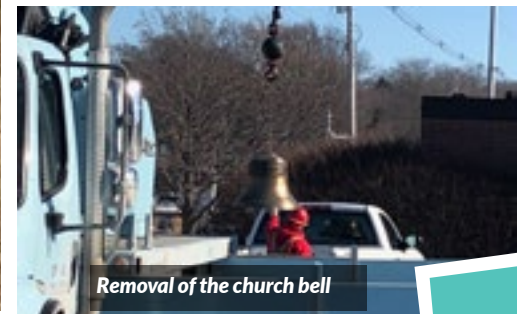

JANUARY HAPPENINGS AT COUNTRYSIDE

RESTORE THE SHORE

This summer, COYO Sr. High is going back to the Jersey Shore in Wall, New Jersey, to do repair and rebuild homes that were damaged during Hurricane Sandy in 2012 - five years ago. There are still over 300 families not in their homes just in the Wall Township area. Students will work alongside Americorps members. The organization that is in charge of the effort, SBP, has existed since Hurricane Katrina and has helped thousands of families rebuild. Federal assistance has long run out in New Jersey, so our help is needed to Restore the Shore.

Last year's mission trip was the best mission trip I have ever done in 24 years. SBP was an outstanding organization that could provide meaningful work for a large group, encourage students to work hard through the leadership of Americorps volunteers, and bring hope (not just labor) to families who very much need it. The accommodations at Camp Evans were outstanding under the leadership of Joy Blazak. And, I have never seen a youth group work harder! They were united and motivated to Restore the Shore! - Will Howell, Director of Youth Ministries.

HISTORIAN'S CORNER

In January of this year, Countryside's bell was removed from the bell tower to be refurbished before installation at the church's new building at the Tri-Faith Commons. The world famous Royal Eijsbouts bell foundry in the town of Asten, Netherlands, cast the bell in 1965. The bell was originally installed in 1965 when the church's existing sanctuary was first built in 1965. The bell and the church's existing spire sat over the roof of the Sanctuary. When the Sanctuary was remodeled and the Foyer added in 2000, the bell and the spire moved on top of the newly built Margre Durham Bell Tower

The design on the bell is meant to resemble corn stalks, since the region the Royal Eijsbouts bell foundry is known for their corn production. The inscription on the bell translates..."Eijsbouts made this bell in Asten in 1965".

As a side note: In 2014, the Notre-Dame Cathedral in Paris, France celebrated its 850th anniversary. On this occasion, it was decided to restore the bells of the Cathedral to their former glory with a new set of bells. The order was given to the Royal Eijsbouts foundry in Asten, where the largest bell (Marie) was produced.

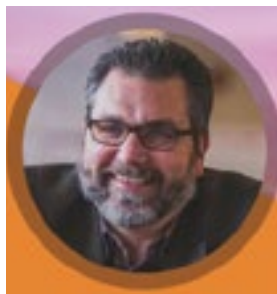

CONVERGING PATHS PODCAST

The Converging Paths Podcast is a weekly audio podcast with Dr. Eric Elnes where "God experiences" converge with everyday life, turning each day into a potential encounter with the Holy. Dr. Elnes has interviewed nationally-recognized faith leaders Floyd Thompkins, Chuck Marohnic, Marcia McFee and Bruce Van Blair about their "God experiences" and how these experiences continue to inform their everyday life and work. After the interview, Dr. Elnes offers a guided meditation in which wisdom is gleaned from the interview, is organically integrated into an experience of prayer and meditation that may just provide that "meeting ground" between yourself and God that you've been looking for. Institute for Holocaust Education, Tuesday, March 20 at 7 PM

Dr. Mark Wygoda is the son of Hermann Wygoda who is also known as "Comandante Enrico," to the 2,500 partisan troops he commanded as a Division Commander in the Italian Liberation Army from 1944-45. His family's sole survivor, Hermann was a German-born Polish Jew who lived a covert life both in Poland, where he had been a smuggler to the Warsaw ghetto, and in Germany, where he had been a foreman, translator, and armed courier for a German business. As a Partisan commander, he planned war actions, negotiated prisoner exchanges with the local German commander, and ultimately helped liberate the city of Savona, Italy.

Dr. Mark Wygoda, a Biology professor at McNeese State University, will share his father's amazing story and its lessons with our community, as we honor and remember the victims and survivors of the Holocaust.

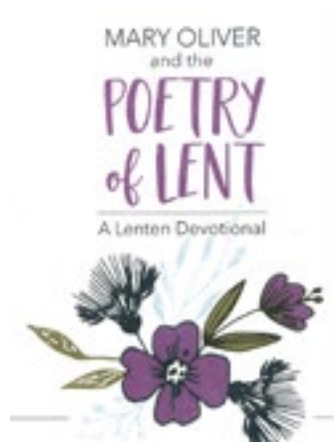

Core 56

Our Core 56 groups welcomes all students in 5th and 6th grade to meet to discuss scripture stories that center primarily around the New testament and the teachings of Jesus. Each week, we will discuss scripture stories, consider historical and cultural context, and contemplate how we can use what we have learned from them in our lives today. Please ask your Core 56 student to bring their bible—if you don't have one, just ask Rebecca! At the beginning of each class, we will spend some time in a meditative prayer sit, as we build up to 10 minutes by the end of the semester. This past month we hit the seven minute mark so we are well on our way. This month, we will begin a Lenten project, which is usually focused on reprioritizing our personal prayer time.

While it is not required, we ask that you register for Holy Moly and Core 56 by completing the corresponding Google forms on the Countryside website. It is helpful in our planning.

Sunday School

We are very excited to study scripture stories with our Countryside children! During the 9 AM service, our students will meet together in two classrooms: pre-K and one large group for Kindergarten through 6th grade. During the 11 AM service, our students are divided between four classrooms: Pre-K, K-1st, 2nd-4th, and 5th & 6th grades - see below.

We leave together as a group after the Children's Moments and head to classrooms. Students remain in their classrooms until collected by a parent or guardian. Please remember our students and teachers in your prayers as they explore scripture stories together this semester.

This month, our students will begin Gratitude journals, that they will use for the rest of the semester, as well as bookmarks that they will take home.

Children's Education offers programs designed to inspire, explore, and develop a solid faith foundation. Through story, discussion, and experiential activities, our students embark on a Christian path encouraged by enthusiastic study, adventurous approach to Scripture, and cultivation of a strong faith community.

Nursery

Childcare is available during Sunday worship for infants and toddlers ages newborn to two-year-olds. Our nursery staff is trained and have passed background checks.

Family Worship

Typically held on the first Sunday of each month, Family Worship offers the opportunity to share scripture, message, and communion as a family! Children's Bibles, books, and age-appropriate activity bags are available.

Sunday School

Our students and teachers engage with scripture and activities with our in-house curriculum through Countryside's theology and faith practices. Sunday School is offered for students pre-K through 6th grade.

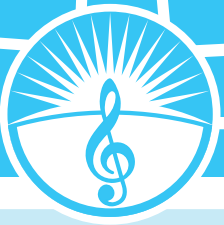

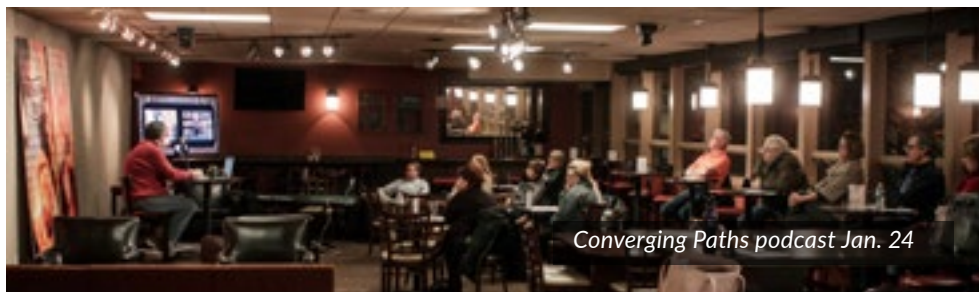

Jewish

Purim February 28- March 1

Purim is celebrated with a public reading—usually in the synagogue—of the Book of Esther (Megillat Esther), which tells the story of the holiday. Under the rule of King Ahashverosh, Haman, the king's prime minister, plots to exterminate all of the Jews of Persia. His plan is foiled by Queen Esther and her cousin Mordechai, who ultimately save the Jews of Persia from destruction. The reading of the megillah typically is a rowdy affair, punctuated by booing and noise-making when Haman's name is read aloud.

Purim is an unusual holiday in many respects. First, Esther is the only biblical book in which God is not mentioned. Second, Purim, like Hanukkah, traditionally is viewed as a minor festival, but elevated to a major holiday as a result of the Jewish historical experience. Over the centuries, Haman became the embodiment of every anti-Semite in every land where Jews were oppressed. The significance of Purim lies not so much in how it began, but in what it has become: a thankful and joyous affirmation of Jewish survival against all odds.
