Good News! As we approach this Thanksgiving holiday, the Countryside Board of Trustees' Stewardship Team would like to express our most sincere thanks and appreciation. Your support, encouragement, and prayers are truly making a difference as we commit our financial resources to our 2018 operating budget, which supports the daily ministry and programming of Countryside. Thank you, thank you, THANK YOU!!!

While we recognize that not all in our community are able to increase their pledge at this time, as a whole community, we have received an incredibly strong response thus far, with 70% of pledges received increasing their commitment to our 2018 operating budget. Many pledges have also begun that increase immediately, to help with our 2017 shortfall. This percentage of increased pledges is higher than anyone can remember in recent years. If you haven't renewed your pledge yet, or if you've never pledged financially to Countryside, this is not the time to back off. The increases we've received have covered \$86,000 of our \$229,000 shortfall for 2018. Now is the time to commit financially to the ministry and programming you experience at Countryside year around. The positive response we've received demonstrates your love for the path we are on together at Countryside. We have a challenge to accomplish our balanced budget. 



Journey Groups





Core 56

Our Core 56 group welcomes all students in 5th and 6th grade to meet and discuss scripture stories, consider historical and cultural context, and contemplate how we can use what we have learned from them in our lives today. Please ask your Core 56 student to bring their bible—if you don't have one, just ask Rebecca! At the beginning of each class, we will spend 3-5 minutes in a meditative prayer sit.

While it is not required, we ask that you register for Holy Moly and Core 56 by completing the corresponding Google forms on the Countryside website. It is helpful in our planning.

Holy Moly

Our students meet in two classrooms on the lower level in groups of K-2nd graders and 3rd and 4th graders. Each week this fall, we will explore an Old Testament tale with storytelling, a short video, and an activity. In November, we will cover the stories of Esther, Ezekiel, Daniel, and Jonah.

Sunday School

During the 9 AM service, our students will meet together in two classrooms: pre-K and one large group for Kindergarten through 6th grade. During the 11 AM service, our students are divided between four classrooms: Pre-K, K-1st, 2nd-4th, and 5th & 6th grades.

We leave together as a group after the Children's Moments and head to classrooms. Students remain in their classrooms until collected by a parent or guardian. Please remember our students and teachers in your prayers as they explore scripture stories together this semester! This month, we will explore the story of Joshua as well as the 23rd Psalm!

Children's Education offers programs designed to inspire, explore, and develop a solid faith foundation. Through story, discussion, and experiential activities, our students embark on a Christian path encouraged by enthusiastic study, adventurous approach to Scripture, and cultivation of a strong faith community.

Nursery

Childcare is available during Sunday worship for infants and toddlers ages newborn to twoyear-olds. Our nursery staff is trained and have passed background checks.

Family Worship

Typically held on the first Sunday of each month, Family Worship offers the opportunity to share scripture, message, and communion as a family! Children's Bibles, books, and age-appropriate activity bags are available.

Sunday School

Our students and teachers engage with scripture and activities with our in-house curriculum through Countryside's theology and faith practices. Sunday School is offered for students pre-K through 6th grade.

Children's Church

This child-centered Worship celebrates our faith stories with songs, scripture, and discussion while honoring faith practices like communion, prayer, and stewardship! It's open to children five years old through 6th grade.

Wednesday Night Programming - Holy Moly

During the school year, K through 4th grade students meet for Holy Moly! A Sparkhouse curriculum teaches Bible stories with multimedia, crafts, activities, and storytelling.

Wednesday Night Programming - Core 56

BOX RESULTS FROM SEPTEMBER

Grief's Journey is at 7811 Farnam Street in Omaha. It is a place where individuals and families can find help, understanding, comfort and hope after suffering a loss. In such times of grief, sharing food and meals with others is part of our culture. During September, disposable plates and napkins were brought to the BOX, along with recyclable cups and plastic-wares. Altogether, we provided 567 plates, 1560 napkins, 445 cups and 924 plastic utensils. Thank you, Countrysiders. Your generosity quietly eliminates a small need during the aftermath from the death of a loved one.

LOOK AT THIS SMALL SERVICE GRANT (SSG)!

Some may recall Vicky and Eva Houston smiling behind a table at Countryside last spring and also towards the end of summer. It is part of their work for Plant One More. The spring table was for giving away free seedlings funded by a Countryside SSG. The summer table was for collecting from those gardeners who brought the bounty from the "one more" plant they nurtured through harvest. This year, Plant One More collected 323 pounds of produce which was donated to Youth Emergency Services(YES!) and Together Inc. Around 100 pounds came through our church via the Carlson-Rizdor Garden. Many thanks to Vicky, Eva and all who helped make a difference in local hunger through this organization.

RELOCATION UPDATE

WHAT IS THE WORSHIP AND MUSIC COMMITTEE EXCITED ABOUT IN OUR NEW CHURCH?

The Committee members had a close look at the latest plans for the Sanctuary, Chapel and Music Department areas. The plans that were met with the greatest excitement are:

Sanctuary

- An inspiring design for worship or congregational gatherings with a dramatic cross as the focal point of the space.
- Curved pews that enfold the people.
- Use of natural light and elements such as wood and tile.
- A flexible chancel area for varied performance options.
- Acoustical properties of the sanctuary will be very fine.
- The organ box will have a translucent scrim that will allow pipe display in varied ways, i.e.: liturgical or neutral colors or solid walllook.

Chapel

• The open views of the Tri-Faith Commons property.

- A flexible space ideal for worship or meeting/lecture events.
- Prominent display of our present Sanctuary cross.
- Access to the small kitchen/service area shared by the Common Grounds.

Music Department

- Flexible layout/design of space for use as a practice/performance area, or a meeting/ lecture space for other member needs.
- Music storage design is ample and accessible from within and outside the room for efficient filing and retrieval of materials.
- Acoustical properties will enhance practice and performance activities.
- Location of the Music Department on the main level with easy access to the Sanctuary and main church offices.

VISITING AMI

What should I wear to services?

Modesty is an important part of the Muslim faith, so we encourage attendees to show respect when dressing for a visit to the center. Women: non-revealing clothes such as long skirts, loose-fitting pants below the knee and sleeved shirts covering the waist are recommended.

Men: slacks or below the knee-length shorts and sleeved shirts are recommended.

When entering the sanctuary, all visitors are asked to remove their shoes.

It is also respectful for women to wear a head scarf when attending the sanctuary.

Will I be expected to participate in the service?

You don't need to participate in any prayer service, yet you are welcomed to do so or reflect and meditate.

Physical touch between males and females is another sensitive issue for Muslims. So no hugs and be sensitive to shaking hands with different genders from the Muslim community. The very common greeting among Muslims is: Assa Lamu Alaikum (peace be to you).

VISITING THE SYNAGOGUE

What should I wear to services?

Most people wear dress pants, nice tops, suits or dresses. While formal dress is not required, Temple Israel requests that you save your blue jeans, t-shirts, sweatshirts and tennis shoes for other activities.

Men and women may choose to wear a head covering or not. A basket of kippot if you would like to wear one. Tallit (prayers shawls) are welcome but they are not provided.

Will I be expected to participate in the service? How will I know what to do?

The person who is leading the service will announce the page number and when you are to stand and sit. Please read aloud and sing with the congregation. During the service, congregants may be called to the bima (pulpit) to light the Shabbat candles, bless the wine, or participate in the Torah service. Please know that these honors are prearranged and you will not be singled out and asked to come on the bima without warning. Please avoid entering or exiting the sanctuary when the Torah is being read. As a courtesy to others and as a sign of respect to the Rabbi or guest speaker, please avoid leaving the sanctuary during the sermon or d'var torah. When the congregation is standing in prayer, we ask that you wait to re-enter the sanctuary until the congregation sits down. Children are welcome in the sanctuary.
